She had Master and Ph.D. of Business Law at the Graduate School of Law, Hitotsubashi University, Tokyo and LL.M. at Columbia Law School, New York, U.S.A. Her doctoral dissertation is titled as "Comparative Study of U.S. Mediation and Japanese Mediation as well as Proposal to Revitalize Japanese Mediation."

She has devoted herself to various types of dispute resolutions from preventive methods of disputes in workplace including organizational ombudsman, mediation, conciliation, arbitration and litigation not only in Japan but also in the U.S. She has been exploring what is the best way to solve what type of disputes from disputants' perspectives. She believes it is critical to build the rapport between dispute resolution practices and academics, which would contribute to the progress of the dispute resolution theories and practices interactively.
