Apart from participating in international academic networks, he advises various international organizations and frequently provides expert opinions on Chinese law across multiple arbitration institutions and courts in Hong Kong, PCA (Hague), Washington DC, Singapore, and England. Professor Chen is an expert member of the Inclusive Global Legal Innovation Platform on Online Dispute Resolution (iGLIP on ODR), collaborating with UNCITRAL.
