Educational / Professional Background

Keron Burrell is currently the Executive Director at the Financial Services Commission (FSC), where he is on Secondment from the Bank of Jamaica. As Executive Director, and under the direction of the Board of Commissioners, he is charged with delivering an effective regulatory programme, which provides adequate safeguards for all stakeholders, and preserves confidence in Jamaica's financial system. Additionally, he is tasked with the build out and implementation of the Market Conduct Framework under the Twin Peaks Model of Supervision, being implemented to create a more robust financial system for the Jamaican economy. His career at the Bank of Jamaica began in 2008, where he held several positions and lead the team charged with spearheading the formulation and improvement of prudential policy and standards for issue to Bank of Jamaica licensees; as well as developing methodologies to guide the Financial Institutions Supervisory Division's (FISD) on and off-site supervisory procedures, in the context of developments in the financial markets and international best practices (as per the Financial Stability Board/Bank for International Settlements or otherwise). In 2020, Keron Burrell was promoted to Deputy Division Chief, Regulations and Policy and added to his portfolio, oversight of the following processes within FISD at the Bank of Jamaica - licensing

and approvals, fitness and propriety, information and knowledge management, and financial analysis and monitoring. He was promoted to Chief Prudential Officer, FISD in August 2022, prior to Secondment.

Keron Burrell holds a MSc in Accounting and a BSc in Economics and Accounting. He is a Fellow of the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Jamaica and holds several certifications in the field of Anti-Money laundering, Accounting and Fraud Investigation. He is a Justice of the Peace (JP) and is a member of many professional associations including the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Jamaica (ICAJ), American Academy of Financial Managers (AAFM), Association of Certified Anti-Money Laundering Specialists (ACAMS), Florida International Bankers Association (FIBA), Association of Certified Financial Crime Specialist (ACFCS), the Association of Certified Fraud Examiners (ACFE) and the Canadian Anti-Money Laundering Institute (CAMLI) to name a few.
